
PROGRESSIVE..... with knowledge abreast of science, a well built and efficient station, and operation beyond reproach.

President Weikal reported no progress had yet been made on conducting an updated inventory of Club-owned equipment – future action pending.


MONDAY NIGHT NET VOLUNTEERS:
